PART 1 (2 minutes)

I: City & Guilds International Spoken ESOL Test, Communicator level, (give today's date).

(NB This introduction only needs to be recorded before the first candidate's test begins, not for subsequent candidates.)

(Give candidate's name.) Test begins. Hello. My name's (give full name). Can you spell your family name for me, please?

- C: (Spells family name.)
- I: Thank you. Where are you from?
- C: (Responds.)
- I: Thank you. Now, in the first part of the test I'm going to ask you some questions about yourself and your ideas. All right? (Choose **up to five** questions, one from each of the different topic areas, as time allows. Name the topic; eg 'Now, The Internet'.)

Topics

The Internet

- Can you tell me what you use the Internet for?
- How have the lives of people you know been changed by having Internet access?
- What uses do you see for the Internet in education in the future?
- Do you think it's possible to control the Internet? Why/Why not?

Sports

- Which sports are increasing in popularity in your country?
- Would you ever take part in 'extreme sports'? Why/Why not?
- What do you think about advertising and sponsorship in sport?
- Is there a difference, in your opinion, between games and sports? Why/Why not?

Food

- What are the advantages of growing food organically?
- Why do you think organic food is often more expensive than non-organic?
- What do you know about the organic food movement in your country?
- Do you read the information on food packaging? Why/Why not?

(continued)

Environment

- What public open spaces are provided in your area?
- How important are open spaces to you?
- What do you tend to use parks for?
- Do you think it's more important to provide housing than open spaces?

Language

- How difficult is it for you to understand different English accents?
- What do you think about local accents and dialects in your own language?
- Many local dialects are disappearing. Why do you think this is?
- Does the way people speak affect the way you think of them?
- C: (Responds.)
- 1: (Interlocutor makes **brief** responses and/or comments.)
- I: Thank you.

PART 2 (2 minutes)

I: Now, Part Two. I'm going to read some situations. I want you to start or respond as necessary. First situation (choose one situation from **A**).

- We're friends. I start.
 We were expecting you for dinner last night. What happened?
- We're students in an English class. I start.
 I don't really think 45 minutes is enough for a lesson. Do you?
- We're work colleagues. I start. I'd never have finished that report without you.

- I: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)

- I'm your boss. You want to change your holiday dates. You start.
- We're friends. I'm stressed. Give me some advice. You start.
- C: (Initiates.)
- 1: (Role-play the situation with the candidate approximately two turns each.)
- 1: (Role-play a third situation from **A** or **B** if time allows.)
- I: Thank you.

PART 3 (3 minutes)

I: Now, Part Three. In this part of the test we're going to discuss something together. I have some ideas and you have some different ones. All right?

We're organising a day out for our English class at the World of Fun Theme Park. Here are some suggestions for the things we need to talk about. (Hand over candidate's task sheet.) Let's talk about the ideas and make some decisions. Take twenty seconds to think about what you want to say. (20 seconds.) Why don't you start?
